In 2009, he and twenty-four of his best friends (seven of them blind) summited Africa's highest mountain, the legendary Mt. Kilimanjaro. After losing his sight, Shihan Armstrong founded Blind Tiger Martial Arts Academy and has been privileged to help other visually impaired individuals learn how to defend themselves and walk with greater confidence in life. He holds a 7th Dan in Kyokhsuin Karate and inspires others, sharing his personal story of triumph over tragedy as he helps people re-evaluate what is and is not a handicap.

Lewis Arnold

Distinguished Master

Professor Arnold started teaching Kajukenbo in 1983. He is the owner and Chief Instructor at LA Academy in Greenville SC. His focus is on raising up a new generation of martial arts students who walk with confidence and live disciplined lives. Professor Arnold is also a professional bodyguard providing protection services to A-Listers, professional athletes, and Hollywood actors.

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Jacob Atkinson **Distinguished Instructor**

Recently promoted to 6th Dan in Okinawan Karate, Renshi Braun has been training for 42 years. He is also proficient in Feeding Crane Kung Fu and has trained in Escrima and Aiki-Jitsu. Today, Renshi "Frozen Crane" Braun is the Chief Instructor at Martial Arts 4 Peace, where he is known for hosting outside classes when it is "warm enough" in Wisconsin (35 degrees) to train. Starting in Judo at the age of 4 and Jiu-Jitsu at 8, GM Antunes surrounded himself with incredible instructors who established early on a strong foundation, along with a fearless spirit of competition. He was promoted by GM Joao Alberto Barreto (Helio Gracie's first black belt) with a 6th Dan in Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu in 2023, and was honored by Gokor Chivychian and Gene LaBell with a Black Belt in Hayastan MMA. Today, he is a 3-Time BJJ World Champion, a 2-Time Pan American Champion (Gi and No Gi), a 4-Time Worlds Masters Medalist, and was ranked #2 in the World in 2017 and 2023. When he is not competing, he is training the next generation of BJJ practitioners, as well as law enforcement, special forces, and executive protection.

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David Bailey

Lifetime of Distinction

David Bailey is a humble, quiet man who is a legend in the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Community. He has received “Top Cop” and Most Distinguished Instructor honors, Police Officer of the Year and Police Officer of the Decade recognitions and is a long-time CLEET Master Instructor at the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Academy. With more than 54 years of experience in martial arts and defensive tactics training, GM Bailey brings a wealth of knowledge and practical application to his classes. He has served as an IMACUSA Camp Instructor and remains an in-demand D/T Instructor. GM Bailey has been previously inducted into the United States Martial Arts Hall of Fame.

Tom Balmos

GM Ed Parker awarded GM Cerio with a 9th Dan Black Belt in Kenpo in 1983. He also trained, and earned a 5th Dan in Okinawan Kobudo under the legendary Tadashi Yamashita. His time training with Chow, Pesare, and other influential instructors weighed heavily on the development of his own system, Nick Cerio’s Kenpo. GM Cerio passed away in 1988, but his Kenpo lineage and legacy continue through more than 65 schools in the US, Canada, Europe, and South Africa affiliated with the Nick Cerio Kenpo Association.

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Robert Clayton

Lifetime of Distinction

An ISKA world-ranked Kata and Weapons champion, GM Robert Clayton has more than 100 first-place wins in his illustrious competition career. An 8th Dan in the Art of Shurin-ji-Ryu, he is the highest-ranking instructor under Tarumasa Ogawa in Seikukan Karate Dojo USA. GM Clayton is a NASKA and United States Martial Arts Competition Team member.

Michael Davenport

Lifetime of Distinction

Celebrating 50 years in martial arts, Master Davenport holds a 5th Dan in Taekwondo. He serves as president of the Oklahoma Karate Association and is the Co-Founder of the Oklahoma Sport Karate Association. Over his competitive career, he has won 19 Oklahoma state titles and was a 4-time OSKA Winner. He was also a #1 ranked NBL and ISKA competitor, Black Belt Competitor and 2-time OSKA Black Belt Man of the Year. Today, he operates a multi-location BJJ Gym in Texas, passing on the Art he loves to children, youth, and adults.

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Dr. Charles Owens **Pioneer Award**

At the ripe young age of 72, Dr. Owens continues to lead by example. He holds a 10th Dan in Kong Soo Sul, a 9th Dan in Taekwondo, 8th Dan in Tang Soo Do, and a 7th Dan in Hapkido. He is a former law enforcement officer and has been a certified instructor for more than 45 years. Throughout his prestigious career, he has been a trailblazer who has led by example. Today, that is still the case. When he's not teaching martial arts, Dr. Owens serves as a pastor, teacher, theologian, author, and an ordained minister. The founder of the American Cane Fighting System, GM Mark Shuey has had a long, illustrious career teaching this eclectic fighting art. An 8-time world champion, he wanted to create a defensive protection system for those age 40 and older, and continues to teach this Art globally. GM Shuey has an affinity for the military, often volunteering his time to teach veterans and presenting them with canes for their military service. He is also a Yoga practitioner, helping young and old improve flexibility and strength.

Lifetime Achievement

A 50-year veteran of martial arts, Master Singletary is a 5th Dan in Taekwondo, a 2nd Dan in Hapkido, and a 1st Dan in Gracie Barra BJJ. He is a 5-time IBJJF Master 7 World Champion, a 6-time IBJJF Master 7 Champion, a 2-time IBJJF European Champion, and was the 2021-22 IBJJF #1 ranked Red Belt in the World.
